## **Piikani Nation Community Update from Chief and Council Legal Update November 10, 2022**

There are four cases that were started long before this term of Council, but it is Council's responsibility to deal with them. Those are the cases against our former investment dealer, Raymond James and Liliana Kostic, and against Dale McMullen (and others). We were elected in part to get those lawsuits dealt with either by trial or settlement. We have been doing that. We have also been handling numerous lawsuits that have been commenced by Piikani members and others against Piikani Nation and Council during our term. Most recently those Actions have been commenced in Federal Court, as Mr. McMullen and Ms. Kostic have been losing most of their appearances before the Court of Queen's Bench (now called the Court of King's Bench) and the Alberta Court of Appeal (more on that below).

We have attached a list of recent and outstanding litigation involving Piikani Nation and Council for reference. We will continue to update Piikani members on these matters.

### **Kostic litigation**

In 2002 the Nation began to receive large amounts of trust monies from the settlement of litigation with Canada and Alberta. As part of the settlement the Nation entered into a Trust Agreement.

The Trust Agreement required trust monies to be invested by an "Investment Counsellor". Investment Counsel have more training than investment dealers, charge much lower fees, and are trained to safely grow the assets they manage. Investment Counsel get paid according to how much money you have invested, so they make more money when your money grows.

Investment dealers do not have the same training. They are most usually paid commissions whenever they make a trade, so they make more money by making trades that pay them commissions and trailing fees for locked in investments

In 2002, Ms. Kostic convinced Piikani Nation to hire CIBC Wood Gundy, where she was working, even though she and Wood Gundy were not Investment Counsellors. At that time Ms. Kostic also convinced Piikani Nation to enter into a personal contract with her, even though it was a breach of Wood Gundy's policies. Ms. Kostic moved to Raymond James in 2004, and convinced Piikani Nation to hire Raymond James, even though she and Raymond James were also not Investment Counsellors.

In late 2006 the Nation ended their investment dealer relationship with Raymond James and the direct agreement with Ms. Kostic. The Nation also filed a lawsuit against both of them.

The lawsuit seeks to prove that the investments at that time were not in line with the Trust Agreement and that the fees charged to Piikani Nation were excessive. In the lawsuit the Nation will need to prove that Ms. Kostic and Raymond James breached their duties to the Nation while

handling the Nation's investments. Piikani Nation is seeking to have the Defendants compensate the Nation for those damages.

The lawsuit against Ms. Kostic has been going on for close to 16 years. It was scheduled to go to trial in 2021, but was adjourned during the Covid-19 pandemic. In 2008, Ms. Kostic sued Piikani Nation for breach of the personal contract.

The lawsuits have taken so long and been so expensive because of Ms. Kostic's actions. We told you at the last band meeting that she has:

- Filed repeated applications, Actions, Third Party Claims, Leave Applications and Appeals;
- Filed an affidavit of over 400 pages to support Dianna North Peigan and the others who claim to be Chief and Council in their efforts to disrupt Nation business and operations; and
- Attempted to file 1,600 pages of materials in the Federal Court action regarding the Removal Appeals Board decision.

What all of this amounts to is a significant amount of time, energy and money spent trying to address all of these needless and endless applications and documents being sent by Ms. Kostic to the Court.

It is clear from her materials – and the fact that she joined forces with Brian Jackson, Dianna North Peigan, Rod North Peigan, Rick Yellow Horn, Janet Potts, Lynol Smith, Terry North Peigan, Willard Yellow Face, Kalvin Bastien, Glenda Pard and Vanessa One Owl – that she is actively attempting to undermine our Nation's governance and ability to conduct business.

**Since June 2020, Liliana Kostic has filed four lawsuits against one or more of Piikani Nation, Council or individual members of Council, and has attempted to intervene in lawsuits commenced by others, including Brian Jackson and Dianna North Peigan**

Some of the litigation that Ms. Kostic has commenced against Piikani Nation and Council or has tried to become involved in over the past few years include the following:

- Filing a 192-page claim in Federal Court against Piikani Nation, current and former members of Council, Piikani business entities, and our professional advisors, in which she seeks damages of at least \$12,000,000;
- Attempting to be named a party to the injunction proceedings against Dianna North Peigan and the other members who claim to have been elected in January 2022, on the basis that she has a financial interest in having these individuals declared the legitimate Piikani Nation Council;
- Playing a role in the litigation that Dianna North Peigan brought against Council in the Federal Court seeking to have Council removed from office;
- Attempting to become involved in litigation commenced by Brian Jackson against the Council in the Federal Court;
- With Janet Potts, filing a lawsuit against the Piikani Nation Removal Appeals Board that was appointed to hear the petition to remove Brian Jackson;
- With Glenda Pard, filing two new lawsuits in Federal Court against Piikani Nation Chief and Council members seeking various orders from the Court, including seeking an order to access a minimum of \$1,000,000 from our Piikani Trust; and

- Filing a third party claim against Piikani Nation, claiming that she is entitled to be indemnified by Piikani Nation for proceedings brought against her by a company who loaned money to her so that she could sue Piikani Nation in 2008

In the Nation's lawsuit against her, Ms. Kostic has repeatedly lost applications, has had Actions and Third Party Notices dismissed, has had proceedings halted by the Court and has appealed unsuccessfully many times to the Alberta Court of Appeal. In 2018 alone she lost 6 appeals and later one of our professional advisors had her declared in contempt of Court.

There are a few additional points worth mentioning about all of this:

- Ms. Kostic relies on a lot of evidence provided by Brian Jackson both when he was a sitting member of Council and when he wasn't. Brian even swore an affidavit that assisted Ms. Kostic in extending questioning in the Nation's lawsuit against her.
- Recently Rod North Peigan and his group (Rick Yellow Horn, Lynol Smith, Terry North Peigan, Willard Yellow Face, Calvin Bastien, Glenda Pard and Vanessa One Owl) apparently executed a band council resolution to try and settle with Ms. Kostic, which is why she supports Dianna and Rod and the others in their efforts to unseat the existing and duly elected Council (they had no authority to execute a BCR as Rod's group are not on Council).
- We don't know the amount that Dianna and Rod agreed to pay Ms. Kostic, or the terms, but we can assume that it would be many millions of dollars.
- Any proposed settlement with Ms. Kostic or others has not been made with proper authorization, and so is not valid. But it does raise questions as to why Rod and the others were so quick to settle with a woman who has done so much damage to our Nation. We don't have the answers yet to those questions.
- Given the damage Ms. Kostic has done, and the enormous cost to the Nation in dealing with her delay tactics and numerous and unnecessary litigation filings, your current elected Council is quite concerned that Rod and the others are prepared to settle with her when elected Councils from 2007 onward were not.
- With Janet Potts, Ms. Kostic commenced a lawsuit in Federal Court against the Piikani Nation Removal Appeals Board to ask the Court to order the Board to stop moving ahead to a hearing of the petition to remove Brian Jackson from office.
- We are also concerned that Ms. Kostic and Rick Yellow Horn have been trying to intervene in proceedings involving Brian Jackson and that Brian has hired Ms. Kostic's lawyer to represent him. That same lawyer is representing Dianna, Rod, Glenda, Rick and the others in various matters involving Piikani Nation.

We fully expect that Ms. Kostic will continue her efforts to be disruptive, and that there will be more resources – the Nation's resources – spent to deal with her endless applications and support of Rod, Diana, Brian, Janet, Rick and the others.

For the Nation's claim against Ms. Kostic, we had scheduled dates in November of 2021 for trial, but unfortunately the lawsuit was delayed. Although the delay was in part due to the impact of COVID, it was also a direct result of assistance that Ms. Kostic has been receiving and continues to receive from Piikani members.

That assistance has meant that the questioning process has been unnecessarily prolonged. This takes time and money –which almost certainly would not have been necessary had Piikani members not assisted Ms. Kostic.

As a result, we do not yet have rescheduled trial dates.

In her 192-page Federal Court lawsuit against Piikani Nation and Council, she is claiming \$12,000,000 dollars in damages. When she first filed her claim on June 29, 2020, she included Brian Jackson, Janet Potts, Rod North Peigan and Daniel Northman as defendants. When she amended her claim on January 29, 2021, she removed Brian Jackson as a defendant. When she amended her claim for a second time on April 26, 2021, she removed Rod North Peigan, Janet Potts and Daniel Northman as defendants. No reason was given for removing these Piikani members as defendants to her claim, though she is working with them on other matters.

Most recently, Ms. Kostic filed a motion in Federal Court seeking to have the Court admit more evidence sworn on her behalf by Brian Jackson, Rod North Peigan and Rick Yellow Horn. These three Piikani members, along with Janet Potts, support Ms. Kostic's motion to have Piikani Nation, CIBC Trust and Raymond James pay for Ms. Kostic's lawyer and other legal costs for suing them and for her involvement in other lawsuits. This is in addition to her and Glenda Pard's attempt to access a minimum of \$1,000,000 from our Piikani Trust and to have Rod North Peigan and his group declared to be the duly elected Council.

In fact, in his affidavit sworn October 25, 2022 in support of Ms. Kostic, Brian Jackson states as follows:

110. We the 2003 to 2007 quorum of the Chief and Council support the Application for save harmless and indemnity relief sought by Liliana Kostic under the Bridgepoint action 2101-06345 or under any other related action and it is my/our intention to join the application or file concurrently another application as the 2003-2007 Quorum of Council, inclusive of Councillor Janet Potts.

111. We will also seek an Order or Declaration declaring that the CIBC defendants and [Raymond James] are under an immediate and ongoing obligation pursuant to the obligation to its employee/disclosed agent Investment Advisor Kostic to indemnify and save her harmless pursuant to the Wood Gundy and Raymond James Ltd. terms and Conditions and to pay forthwith and without delay any and all claims, losses, liabilities, damages, costs, charges and expenses including legal fees as set out in the Affidavit of Liliana Kostic filed July 7, 2016 in the 1601-01693 Kostic v CIBC Trust Action.

112. It will be our intention to invoke similar rights under the same contracts and to seek a declaring [sic] that the named Respondents breached their contractual duty to defend and hold the us [sic] harmless from any, and all claims, losses, liabilities, damages, costs, charges and expenses including legal fees as set out in the Account Agreements from the date of first request in 2006 and onward.

In their affidavit sworn October 25, 2022, Rod North Peigan and Rick Yellow Horn adopt all of Ms. Kostic's evidence that she has attempted to put before the Court in a variety of lawsuits.

What this all means is that Brian Jackson, Janet Potts, Rod North Peigan, Rick Yellow Horn and the other members of the 2003-2007 Council that were aligned with them:

- support Ms. Kostic in her litigation against Piikani Nation, notwithstanding that it directly results in damage to the interests of Piikani members and our Piikani Trust; and
- intend to bring further litigation against Piikani Nation and CIBC to support Ms. Kostic, which will lead to further costs and delays in getting these matters resolved.

Piikani members should be aware that every time CIBC Trust as Trustee is sued by Ms. Kostic or a Piikani member, or CIBC's legal counsel is sued, the legal fees paid to defend CIBC Trust or its legal counsel come out of our Piikani Trust. That means that all of this litigation costs you as Piikani members the fees paid to Piikani Nation's lawyers, but also to the lawyers for the Trustee.

**Brian Jackson, Janet Potts, Dianna North Peigan, Rod North Peigan, Rick Yellow Horn, Lynol Smith, Terry North Peigan, Willard Yellow Face, Calvin Bastien, Glenda Pard and Vanessa One Owl are spending time and effort to support Ms. Kostic. How does this benefit Piikani Nation and our people? To date, they have not offered an explanation.**

The upshot is that Rod North Peigan and his group (Rick Yellow Horn, Lynol Smith, Terry North Peigan, Willard Yellow Face, Calvin Bastien, Glenda Pard and Vanessa One Owl) have agreed upon the amount to be paid to Ms. Kostic to settle her litigation as if they were the elected Council, and she is now actively trying to have the Courts declare them to be the duly elected Council.

Here is the good news:

- As previously reported, we have obtained an injunction against Dianna North Peigan, Rod North Peigan and his group, including Ms. Kostic, which prohibits them from:
  - interfering with Nation or Council business or operations;
  - holding themselves out to be the properly and legally elected Chief and Council;
  - taking any actions in the name of Piikani Nation or the Chief and Council; or
  - communicating with the public or any third parties under the name of Piikani Nation and/or as Chief Electoral Officer or a duly elected Chief or Councillor.
- The injunction is still in place.
- As previously reported, the lawsuit commenced by Dianna North Peigan in Federal Court was struck from the court record (meaning that it was removed from the court record).
- The litigation commenced by Brian Jackson against Council in the Federal Court has been struck from the court record, and Council was awarded costs against Brian Jackson.
- Ms. Kostic's third party claim against Piikani Nation has been struck in the proceedings where her lender sued her.
- We have filed a motion to have Ms. Kostic's 192-page claim struck from the Federal Court record.
- We have filed a motion to have the duplicate lawsuits filed by Ms. Kostic and Glenda Pard in Federal Court struck.

Although it is good news that the courts are removing these matters from the court record, it is not done before significant time and effort is put into these matters. It is not automatic – our lawyers put in a lot of time and effort to make these applications to have these matters struck.

Not only is Ms. Kostic costing us time and money, but so is any Piikani member who assists Ms. Kostic in these matters – like Dianna, Brian, Rod, Glenda and the others.

Any money we have had to spend on litigation involving Ms. Kostic are monies that are not available to Piikani members for programs and services.

### **Jackson litigation**

As we have previously reported, Brian Jackson has commenced litigation against Piikani Nation and Council over the past two years:

- On November 9, 2020, Brian filed a lawsuit in Federal Court against Council to stop the proceedings before the Piikani Nation Removal Appeals Board from proceeding. This lawsuit was dismissed on March 8, 2022, and Brian was ordered to pay costs to Council. Brian did not appeal this decision.
- On April 21, 2022, Brian filed an appeal of an order made by the Federal Court. Brian did not take any steps to pursue the appeal. As a result, on September 16, 2022, the Federal Court of Appeal dismissed the appeal.

Most recently, on November 3, 2022, Brian filed a lawsuit in the Federal Court against the individual Chief and Council members seeking to, among other things, set aside the amendments made by Council to the *Piikani Nation Election Bylaw, 2002* and *Piikani Nation Election Regulations, 2002*. As noted in our recent communication to members, these amendments were made to ensure that our elections legislation is clear, transparent and up-to-date.

Brian claims that the amendments are unfair to him (among others), although he has not yet filed any evidence to support his claim. Brian has retained the same lawyer who represents Ms. Kostic, Glenda Pard, and Rod North Peigan and his group for this lawsuit.

These matters are in addition to the support that Brian has been providing to Ms. Kostic in her lawsuits against Piikani Nation and Council.

Again, we repeat that any money we have to spend on this litigation is then not available to Piikani members for programs and services.

#### **Pard litigation**

As we have previously reported, Glenda Pard filed a lawsuit in Federal Court against the individual Chief and Council members (among others) on her own behalf and on behalf of Rod North Peigan, Terry North Peigan, Rick Yellow Horn, Vanessa One Owl, Willard Yellow Face, Lynol Smith and Calvin Bastien. In that lawsuit, which is virtually identical to one filed by Ms. Kostic on the same date, she asked the Court to:

- Set aside the decision made by Council to apply for judicial review of the decision made by the Piikani Nation Removal Appeals Board on July 7, 2021;
- Order that they be given access to a minimum of \$1,000,000 from the Piikani Trust;
- Order that an independent trustee, in addition to CIBC Trust (our current Trustee), be appointed to administer all Piikani Nation funds;
- Order that an independent forensic audit since 2003 onwards be obtained; and
- Order that any allegedly defamatory or slanderous statements against Ms. Kostic be prohibited.

It is still not clear why the Pard group wished to prevent the Board's decision from being reviewed by the Federal Court. The Pard group retained the same lawyer who represents Ms. Kostic in other matters to act as their counsel for this lawsuit.

Since the lawsuit was filed in April 2022, Piikani Nation has expended significant time and resources to address this matter. Ms. Kostic and Glenda filed an appeal of an order directing that the motions to strike their lawsuits be heard first, before any of their motions. We are in the process of responding to that appeal.

With respect to the motions to strike her lawsuit, Ms. Pard's deadline to file materials in response to the motion to strike was October 31, 2022. She did not file any materials to respond.

Again, more money is being spent on litigation that is wholly unnecessary. That money is not available to Piikani members for programs and services.

### **McMullen litigation**

In 2010, Piikani Nation commenced a lawsuit against Dale McMullen, the former Managing Director of Piikani Investment Corporation and Piikani Energy Corporation, along with six other individuals. The Nation is seeking to recover money that was taken from the Piikani Trust.

In 2018, Mr. McMullen asked the Court for permission to make a variety of different applications, including naming our professional advisors as parties to the litigation, seeking indemnity from Piikani Nation and Piikani Investment Corporation, and seeking to have the lawsuit against him dismissed. None of these applications was permitted by the Court to proceed.

Mr. McMullen appealed. The Alberta Court of Appeal dismissed all eight of his appeals and three applications that he attempted to bring to that Court.

As a result of his failed efforts, all of the other parties were awarded costs, including the Piikani Nation. We are now moving forward to collect those costs.

We have also filed an application to have Mr. McMullen held in contempt for his repeated refusals to follow Court Orders. We are waiting for the Court to schedule the hearing for our application.

Unfortunately, those are not the only proceedings involving Mr. McMullen and Piikani Nation. In January 2020, Mr. McMullen sued Piikani Nation, individual Council members, our professional advisors and others in the Federal Court, claiming \$10 million in damages.

Piikani Nation and the other defendants have brought a motion to strike the claim (meaning remove it from the Court record), and are now waiting for the Court's decision. If we are successful in having the claim struck, we will be seeking costs against Mr. McMullen.

### **Conclusion**

Overall, we remain very concerned about the significant amount of money and time being spent on matters, applications and appeals brought by or involving Ms. Kostic or Mr. McMullen. Any Piikani member who assists Ms. Kostic or Mr. McMullen in these matters is actively hurting Piikani Nation and its members, and is costing us time and money.
